- 2. Of those who did not pass this course what was the reason (by percentage)?
- 3. What was the percentage pass rate of the Royal Engineer Phase 2 A Combat Engineer Courses that completed in 2010 and 2011?
- 4. What was the percentage pass rate of the Royal Engineer Phase 2 B POM(Plant Operator Mechanic) Courses that finished in 2011 and 2012?
- 5. What was the average length of time taken for successful trainees to complete the Phase 2 B(POM) course in 2011 and 2012?
